# HIGHEST PRIORITY RECOMMENDATION

• Cash assistance for those enrolled in SHS services

# ADD HOUSING FIRST PROJECTS TO THE JOINT OFFICE'S HOUSING PORTFOLIO

- Prioritize SHS services & housing for people whose camps are swept
- Increase investment in identity-related housing & retention services
- Add and increase housing programs for LGBTQIA2S+ people

# EVICTION PREVENTION

- Increase investment in homelessness prevention
- While implementation ramps up, invest more in rent & utility assistance—our community needs money now.

## IN-HOUSE PROGRAMMING & WRAP-AROUND SERVICES

- More investment in 24-hour security across our housing portfolio
- Car repair and maintenance for those awaiting housing
- Increase flexible client assistance
- Increase investment in workforce development for people exiting homelessness

## **REFERRAL SYSTEM**

• Expansion of 211 capacity & modernize system infrastructure

## SYSTEM INFRASTRUCTURE

- Increase technical support with contracting and overall contracting capacity at JOHS to support community-based organizations
- Peer support programming for people experiencing housing insecurity to regain long-term housing

## **Definition of Housing First**

Housing First is an approach to quickly and successfully connect people experiencing homelessness to permanent housing without preconditions or barriers such as sobriety, treatment, or service participation requirements, according to the Department of Housing and Urban Development.
