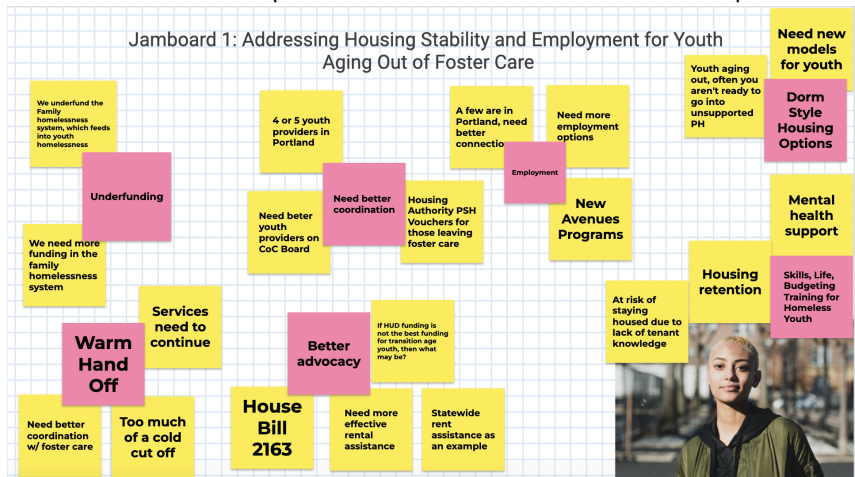

Opportunity to Comment: HUD's Proposed Rule, "Reducing Barriers to HUD-Assisted Housing"	<p>CoC Lead shared the <a href="#">proposed rule</a> with the board, as well as the public comment opportunity.</p> <p>Q&amp;A:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Is anyone doing a pilot of this rule? Are they getting feedback from this community?               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ The rule is based on: 1) the interim rule and 2) HUD guidance. HUD is informed by community feedback. 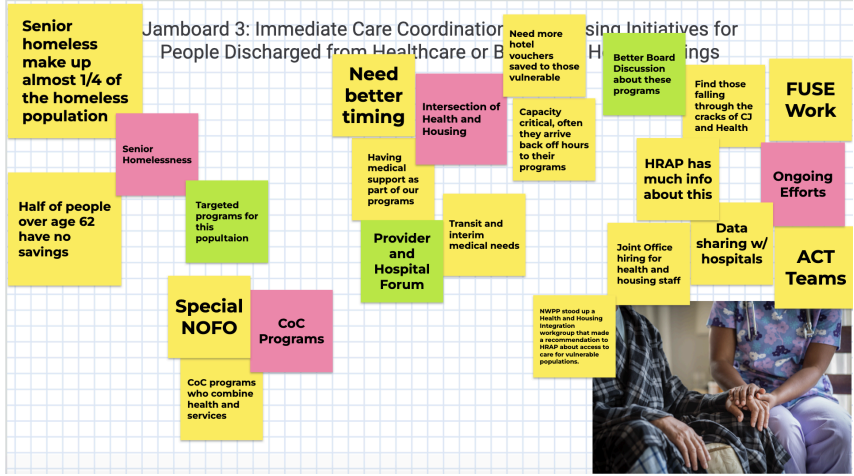
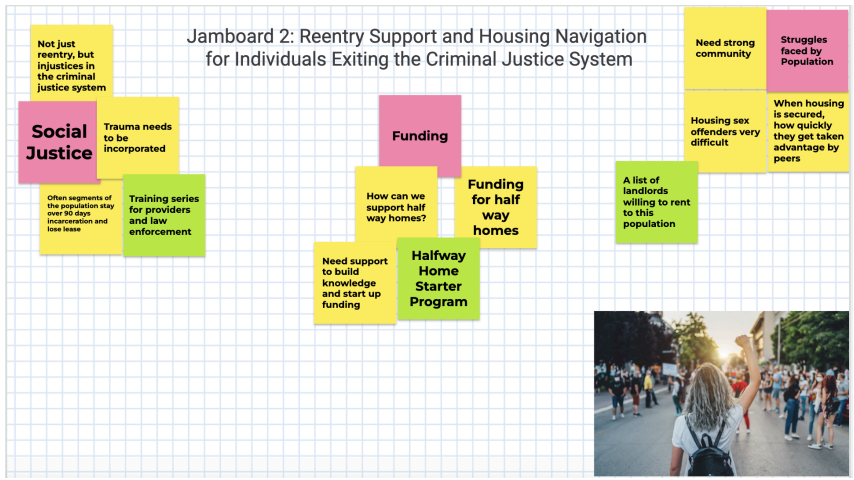

Strategy 1.2 Lead, on behalf of the workgroup, presented a summary of the group's actions, successes/challenges, population data and economic/social/systemic factors. See strategy 1.2 presentation slides 1-28

- CoC Lead shared that the board will get a presentation in June regarding the 2023 and 2024 PIT Count
- Planning & Evaluation manager explained that two years ago, the tri-county decided to add coordinated entry info to the PIT count; most other communities do not do this. Unintended consequence is more accurate data; for example, we believe there was an increase in family homelessness, but not the radical increase we saw. This change creates the issue of accuracy vs comparability to other CoCs.
  - Even with this different methodology, the family population data is a evere undercount; ODE reports over 4000 children '22-'23 school year experienced homelessness. Yet, the family system only gets 6% of the total JOHS budget.
  - JOHS is moving towards using HMIS data/Built for Zero style data to look at homelessness for the reasons described: we can look at data very frequently including inflow.

They also led a discussion with Patrick Wigmore from HomeBase about how best to align and respond to the [Homelessness Response Action Plan](#). See strategy 1.2 presentation slides 28-35. Jamboards below capture board members ideas and responses.
