Provider presentation - Urban League	<p>Leor Beverly and Kelly Irish talked about Project Haven, which is HUD funded, and other projects and services</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Supports 47 scattered-site households at 98% occupancy ● Food Pantry Project provides robust, culturally-specific food choices ● Onsite medical services ● Career connections onsite ● Detox referrals <p>They also discussed challenges and program improvements.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Mental health & addiction services funding needed for more services <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Participants dying from fentanyl ● Improving alliances with community partners <p>Q&A</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● What does the onsite mental health look like? <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Test pilot with a mental health provider in group setting, called emotion management, with anger management cohort currently ○ Also doing engagements, like sip (tea/coffee) & paint ● Hard to hear about stigma built around fentanyl; focus should switch from criminalization/retraumatizing because that's the big harm; people using by themselves is what 	

	<p>kills; need more low-barrier shelter and needle exchange and trauma-informed care</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Hoping to relay that we make opportunities available through our PSH, knowing people aren't always ready ● CoC lead told Urban League staff they can apply for HUD expansion grant for services 	
<p>PIT Count presentation</p>	<p>Claudia Sharygin, JOHS Sr. Research & Data Analyst, shared info about the 2024 PIT Count with the Board.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● See slides for data ● 2024 was a shelter & transitional housing count only ● 2023 was first coordinated tri-county count <p>Q&A</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Does adult only households data, for example, include street count and shelter and PSH? <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Street count = 2023, shelter count = shelter, PSH not included because considered housed ○ Not doing a 2024 press release because of challenge explaining the difference this year ● Are there any other factors besides changing capacity in the system? <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Change in utilization because they are all sheltered <p>2025 PIT Count will be tri-county coordinated and include street count.</p> <p>Moving to a regional data infrastructure with Built for Zero framework and regular inflow, outflow and total population reporting. By-Name list reporting provides real-time info, reliable estimates, better use of resources, safer community approach than PIT.</p> <p>Q&A</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Is the by-name list inclusive of families with children, or does it just represent adult individuals? <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Everybody unsheltered ● 5,398 seems small; how many people do you think are missing from the list and how was it compiled? <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Interaction with Outreach recorded in HMIS and again within 90 days; exited shelter or housing program to unsheltered homelessness ○ Hope to develop sampling methodology through street survey tool to improve By-Name List data quality ● If a person never interacts with a service provider, they are not on the by-name list? <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Yes, but self-reported interactions are often lower than reality 	<p>System performance housing services report Q3: https://public.tableau.com/app/profile/johs/viz/JOHSSystemPerformanceQuarterlyReport-FY24Q3/Report</p>
