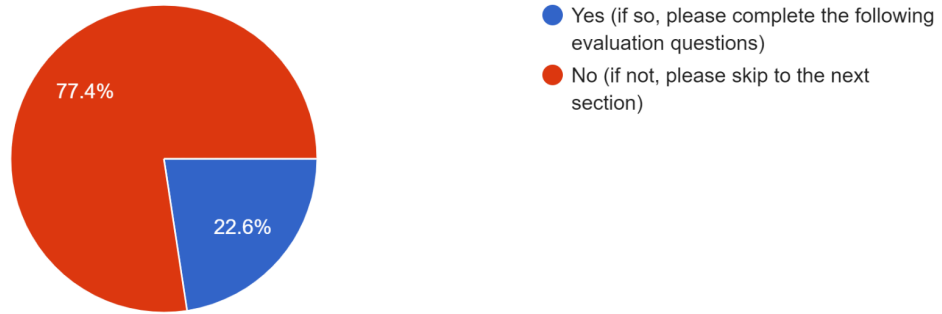

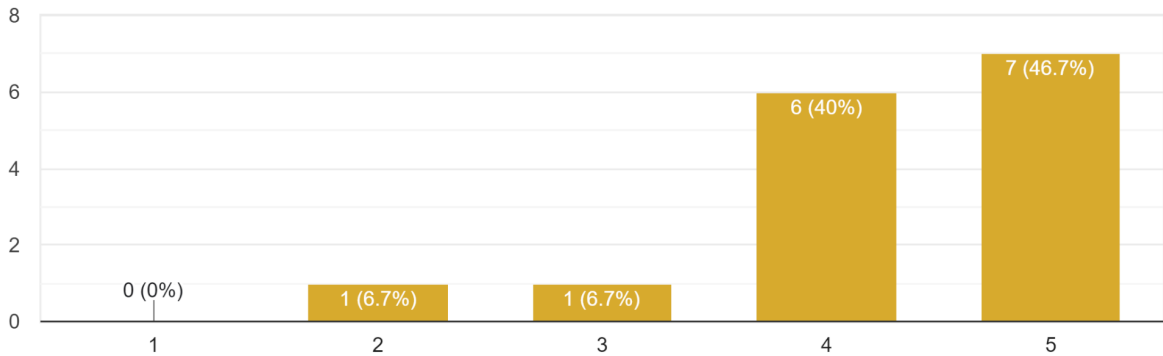

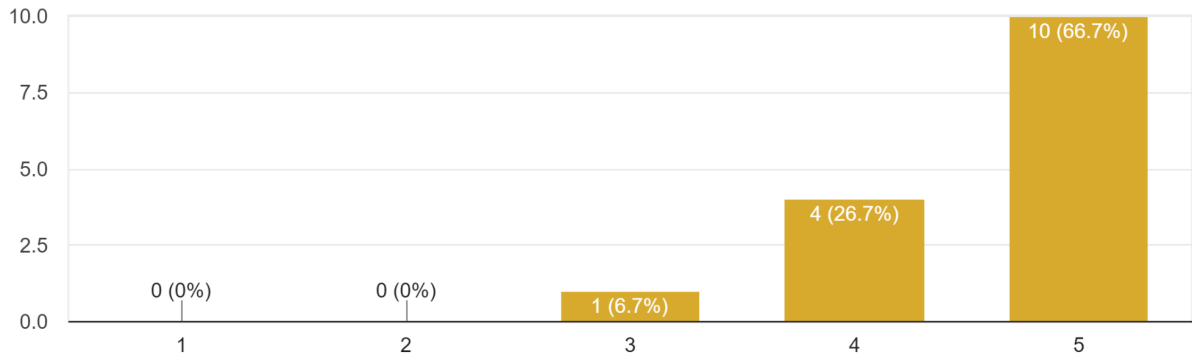
The purpose or goals of the session were clear

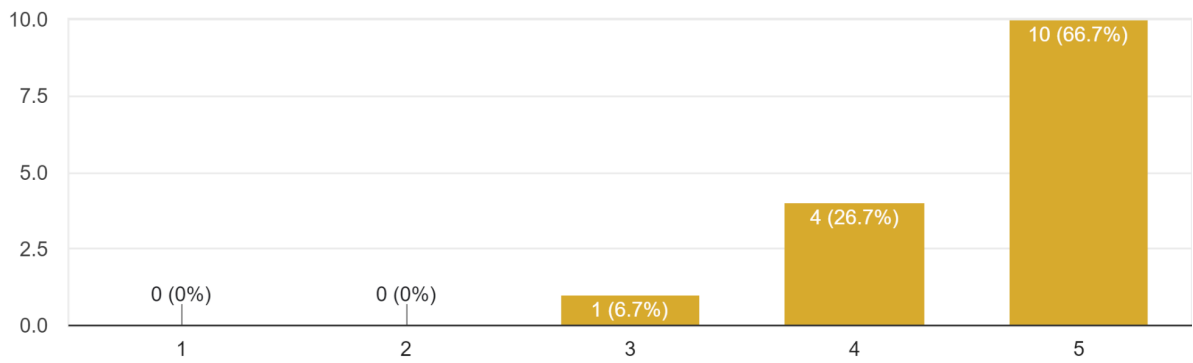

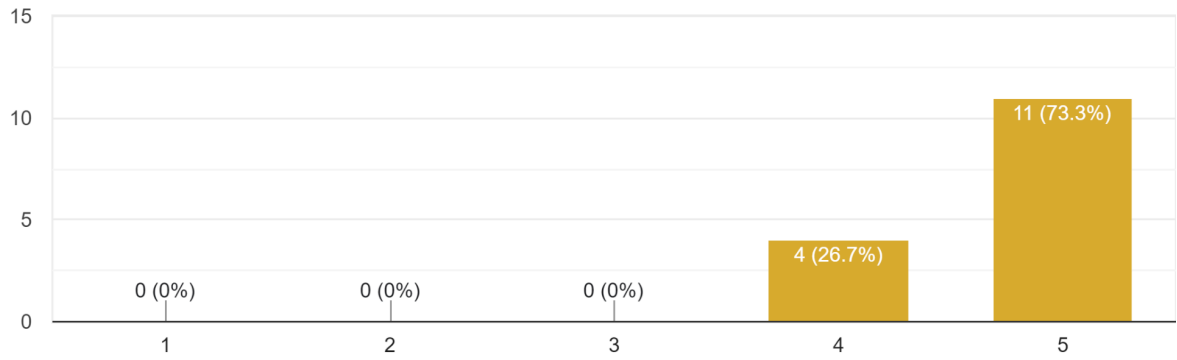
### The session host/presenter was organized and presented their material well

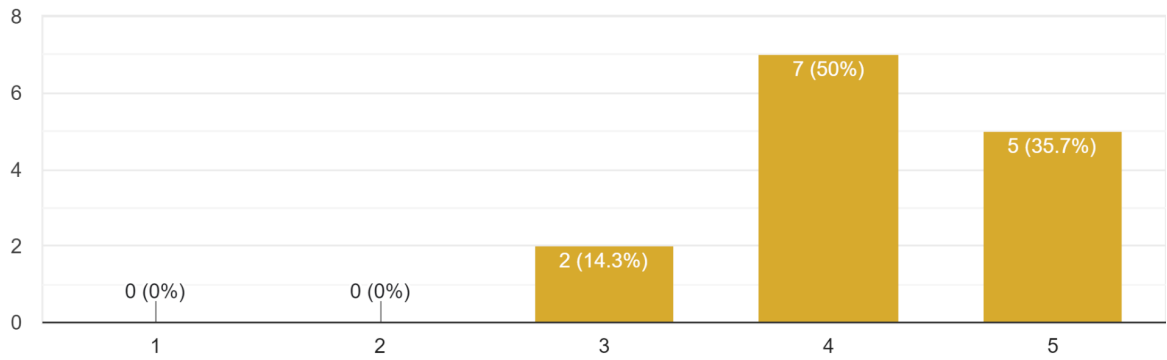

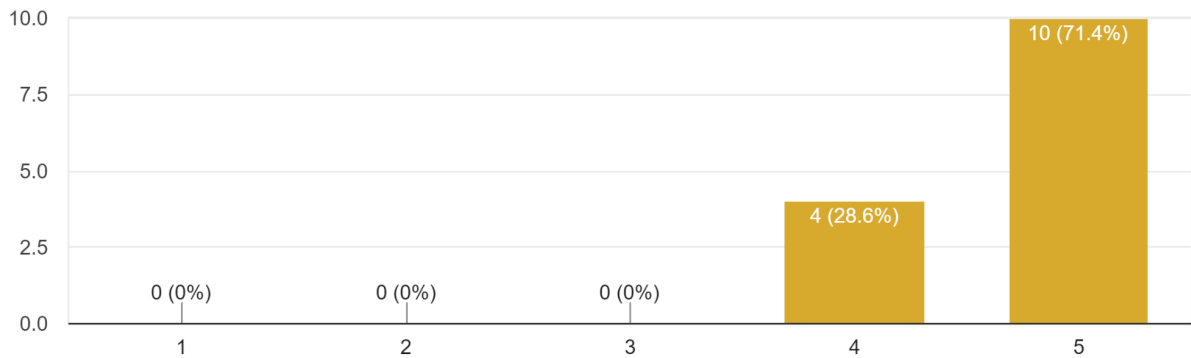

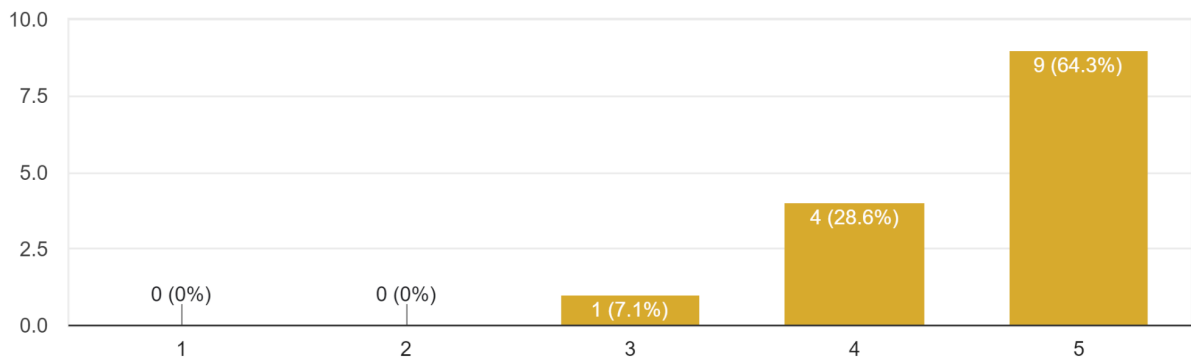
