Discussion/Q&A with JOHS Deputy Director	 Anna Plumb's first visit to the CBAC meeting! Q&A What is the barrier that has prevented the CBAC from getting data re: equity measures? Currently, Program Offers just list yes/no if the offer meets our equity goals JOHS is trying to ensure our outcomes are a better match to services and metrics Data was in most of the program offers; we're creating a data mart that will better monitor outcomes Commit to reducing unsheltered: couldn't conduct analysis of inflow for FY25; surprised JOHS don't have that info since working on this for 8 years and Built for Zero. Where does this stand? 	Confirm with CBAC interest in presentations /discussion on the SHS LIP and HRAP

 We're tracking inflow, but hesitate to predict inflow over time because causes of homelessness is complex Discussion with HRS and federal partners about how to better analyze inflow data to be able to make predictions JOHS current outcomes will be presented in new dashboards coming online this winter; will show real-time inflow and outflow (not future prediction) CBAC suggested a direct cash pilot for two years, but haven't received a response since it's not a budget question; confused since county code has us participate in policy development and review as well. What is or isn't a budget question? Guidance from OCI and Chair guided CBACs to look at program offers this year; if CBAC wants to discuss, we can put on an agenda Within this set of program offers, CBACs are traditionally asked what questions do you have, what do you support, etc. CBAC member expresses that it feels restrictive that we can't offer, representing the community, ideas. CBAC's timeline is very compressed; the JOHS response letter says we didn't address program offer specifics, but we need them earlier in order to respond. It's compressed for JOHS too. Feels CBAC's work isn't that valuable; so much work has already been done by the time program offers get to us; not a lot of space for impact. Is the work we do going to matter this third year? It's important to have eyes on JOHS budget and whether it aligns with <u>SHS LIP</u> and <u>HRAP</u>, and given alignment what CBAC prioritizes Context -Discussion/Q&A Stephan Herrera and Cathy Sherick first visit to the CBAC existing County with OCI staff meeting! - In listening sessions with community and staff, we collected set of issues we presented to the board of county of commission (including clarity and consistency, with feedback loops)
- Practices and staff changed quickly during the pandemic, which affected communication
- Central CBAC will pull together Winter to Spring 2025
- Hope to provide inflection points where info from the Budget office aligns with CBAC calendar and start earlier going forward
- This CBAC improvement process to take two fiscal years
- Need to make sure OCI has organizational capacity to support CBACs

- Would value communication between JOHS community advisory bodies
 - That's an internal department decision; may be more effective to have other department teams bring the budget to the CBAC
 - Look at how are CBACs onboarding for context
 - OCI is encouraging best practices, not directives
- How are you looking at CBAC process prior to the pandemic, and how diverged from code; how do we know code needs changing if we haven't followed it?
 - All county CBAC members were once onboarded all at the same time, so calendar was more consistent
 - Code was followed, but there wasn't a lot of it; so each dept. was following code as they saw it
 - Updating code will help us clarify consistency for shared understanding
 - Role of OCI would be to create guideline that would complement code
- Anticipating recommended changes to size or terms of CBAC? There'd be value in more representation and how to pass the torch.
 - Diversity is huge concern
 - Orientation to include pairing current with new CBAC members
