
Project Scope

- Develop the first JOHS site intentionally located in Gresham to serve as a Day Center
- Create a low barrier facility that will provide culturally responsive services to ensure equitable access and outcomes for adults of all backgrounds and identities
- Provide an environment of safety and support that allows guests to successfully engage in wrap-around services that facilitate their transition to permanent housing
- Include support programs through person-centered and trauma-informed care principles

Site Features


- Village-style shelter with 28 sleeping units
 - serving up to 42 people
- Day Center and Severe Weather Shelter
- Two (2) sets of fences with privacy fence inside of existing fence
- On-site parking spots
- On-site generator and plans to improve the building to be a resilience hub, e.g., updates to HVAC system
