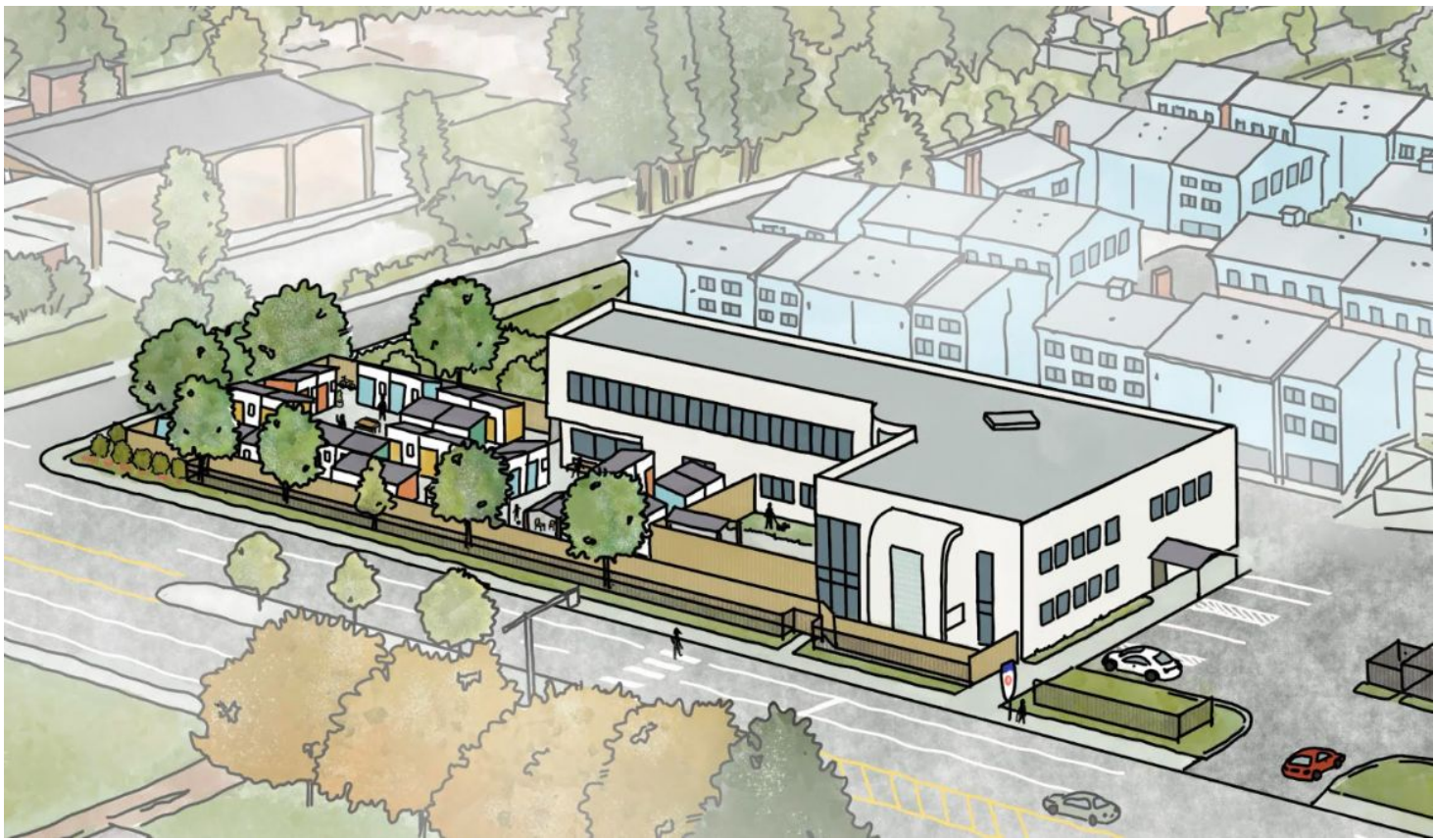

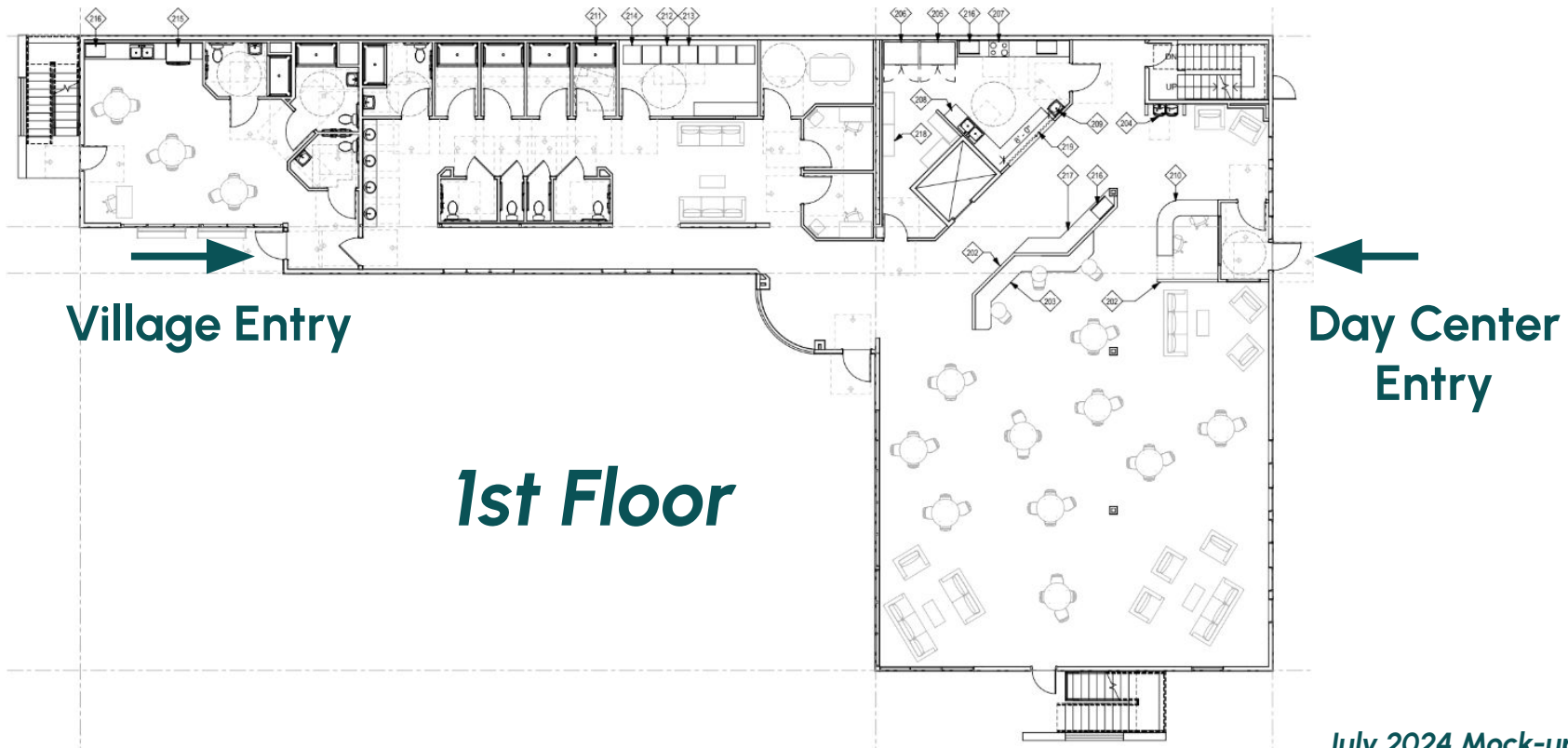
Project Scope

- **Develop the first JOHS site intentionally located in Gresham to serve as a Day Center**
- **Create a low barrier facility that will provide culturally responsive services to ensure equitable access and outcomes for adults of all backgrounds and identities**
- **Provide an environment of safety and support that allows guests to successfully engage in wrap-around services that facilitate their transition to permanent housing**
- **Include support programs through person-centered and trauma-informed care principles**

Site Features

- **Village-style shelter with 28 sleeping units**
 - **servicing up to 42 people**
- **Day Center and Severe Weather Shelter**
- **Two (2) sets of fences with privacy fence inside of existing fence**
- **On-site parking spots**
- **On-site generator and plans to improve the building to be a resilience hub, e.g., updates to HVAC system**
