Land & Labor Acknowledgement

Multnomah County rests on the stolen lands of the Multnomah, Kathlamet, and Clackamas Bands of Chinook Indian Nation; Tualatin Kalapuya; Molalla; and many others along the Columbia River. This country is built on stolen Indigenous land and built by stolen African people. This land was not stolen and people were not enslaved by ambiguous entities and actors. The land was stolen by, and African peoples were enslaved by White settlers who had government support.

We also want to honor the members of over 400 tribal communities who live in Multnomah County. Many of these people and their cultures still survive and resist despite the intentional and ongoing attempts to destroy them. Let us please take a moment of silence to acknowledge the history of how we are here in this place and to honor the People.

- Be authentic and speak your truth.
- Respect and listen to each other, honor each other's perspectives and story.
- Respect confidentiality and don't share other's stories without their permission.
- Give feedback and be open to feedback.
- Differentiate between safety and comfort.
- Be curious and ask questions. Be patient.

Community Agreements Pt. 2

- Differentiate between opinion and informed knowledge.
- Interrupt oppression.
- Expect and accept discomfort and ambiguity.
- Be open to trying something different.
- Be open to hearing something different.
- Share gratitude for feedback.
- Be aware of time.
- Correct with care—assume good intentions.
- Respect names and pronouns (help others when they may make mistakes).
- Stay focused/stay present.
- Understand we are all collectively learning and growing.

Framing the Conversation: Equity Workgroup

What are we talking about?

The equity workgroup met from September 2023 to May 2024 to address one of the SHS committee's top FY24 priorities: **ensuring equity** in SHS programming.

Why is it important?

This is an opportunity for the committee to provide guidance on funding and policies related to equity in our SHS work.

Recommendations

The group's recommendations fell into three categories:



INTERSECTIONAL EQUITY

Consider intersectional identities when developing SHS programming, & involve folks most impacted by disparities in housing & homelessness in discussions, communications, and decision making.



EQUITY INVESTMENTS

- direct cash assistance
- long-term rent assistance
- priority populations
- small, new, and emerging organizations



EVALUATION & ACCOUNTABILITY

Identify specific equity goals, provide clear guidelines, and ensure accountability.

Section 1: Intersectionality & Equity in SHS Work

Recap of feedback:

- Striking mostly the right note.
- Add messaging that incorporates voices of folks who are/have been involved in the justice system.
- Change entire doc to a less academic tone
- Less top-down language throughout the doc, more org/peer driven

Section 2: Evaluation and Accountability

Recap of feedback:

- The accountability and evaluation section and equity investments sections seem like they aren't in alignment.
- Look for ways to reduce admin burden on orgs, and clarify the role of JOHS vs. the provider
- Consider the role of community-based methods of accountability

Section 3: Equity Investments

Recap of feedback:

- Add peer support specialists for formerly incarcerated folks
- Acknowledge barriers experienced by formerly incarcerated folks in accessing housing resources


