## Land & Labor Acknowledgement

Multnomah County rests on the stolen lands of the Multnomah, Kathlamet, and Clackamas Bands of Chinook Indian Nation; Tualatin Kalapuya; Molalla; and many others along the Columbia River. This country is built on stolen Indigenous land and built by stolen African people. This land was not stolen and people were not enslaved by ambiguous entities and actors. The land was stolen by, and African peoples were enslaved by White settlers who had government support.

## Demystifying the Budget Process



### Framing the Conversation: Budget Process

#### What are we talking about?

Each year, the Board of County
Commissioners approve and
adopt an annual budget. The
budget is the roadmap for County
spending for the fiscal year and
lays out the services and
programming funded for the year.

#### Why is it important?

Opportunity for members to learn about County budget process, communicate roles clearly and transparently, identify avenues for participation, and explore how this committee's recommendations are being taken into account.

### **County Budget Process**

#### Phase I

Department Budget Planning (Dec-Feb)

Departments prepare and submit budget requests.



#### **Phase III**

#### Approved (May)

The Board of Commissioners approves the Chair's Proposed budget.



#### **Phase II**

#### Chair's Proposed/Executive (Feb-Apr)

The Chair reviews department budgets and develops the Chair's Proposed budget



#### **Phase IV**

#### Adopted Budget (Jun)

After deliberation, work sessions, and public hearings, the Board adopts the budget.

## FY 2026 Budget Priorities

Resource: Chair's Guidance

#### Chair's Direction

- Maintaining direct services to the community, particularly focused on homelessness, behavioral health, and substance use.
- Eliminating disparities and prioritizing services that focus on populations adversely affected by racism.
- Funding a comprehensive, fair, and accountable system of community safety at current levels.

## How the budget is made

**Equity Evaluation**: Communicates how program uses equity lens for services provided and how the program reaches intended population.

**Program Offers:** Concise description of the program, demonstrating program value for the cost and intended outcomes.



## How the budget is made

**Performance Measures:** Objective indicators that, systematically monitored, assess progress made in achieving intended outcomes, outputs and desired results.

**Revenue & Expense Forecast:** Expenditures represent what it costs to provide services to community. Revenues are tax and non-tax generated resources to pay for services.



## **Budget Process Roles**

We each have a role to play in the budget process.



## **Budget Process Roles: Leadership**

- County Leadership: The Chair and Commissioners guide the budget process by proposing, refining, and ultimately approving a budget that reflects community input and the needs of County departments.
- Joint Office Leadership: Executive leadership receives recommendations and through an equity lens conducts prioritization exercise while examining potential impacts of funding decisions.

## **Budget Process Roles: SHS**

- SHS Team: Provides leadership with SHS guiding framework, recommendations for cross-department SHS funded proposals, and elevates advisory committee recommendations while centering equity throughout the process.
  - Note: The SHS team does not make funding decisions.
- SHS Advisory Committee: Sets annual priorities and creates recommendations for Joint Office Leadership around ongoing SHS implementation. Recommendations used as part of SHS Team budget recommendation process.

## **Budget Process Roles: Public**

- Private Citizens: As citizens of Multnomah County, folks have the ability to attend, observe and participate in public hearings.
- Public Comment: Members of the public can provide both written and verbal comment on the budget that is shared publicly with the Board of County Commissioners.

## **Key Dates**

- **February 14th:** Departments submit budgets and transmittal (budget summary) letters.
- April 24th: Proposed Budget released and posted on <u>Budget Office</u> <u>Website</u>.
- TBD: Public Hearings & Budget Work Sessions
- May 8th: Budget is approved
- June 12th: Budget is adopted
