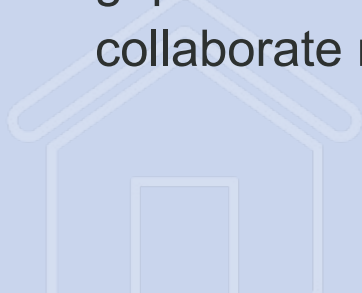
Homelessness and Older Adults in Multnomah County - Status Report



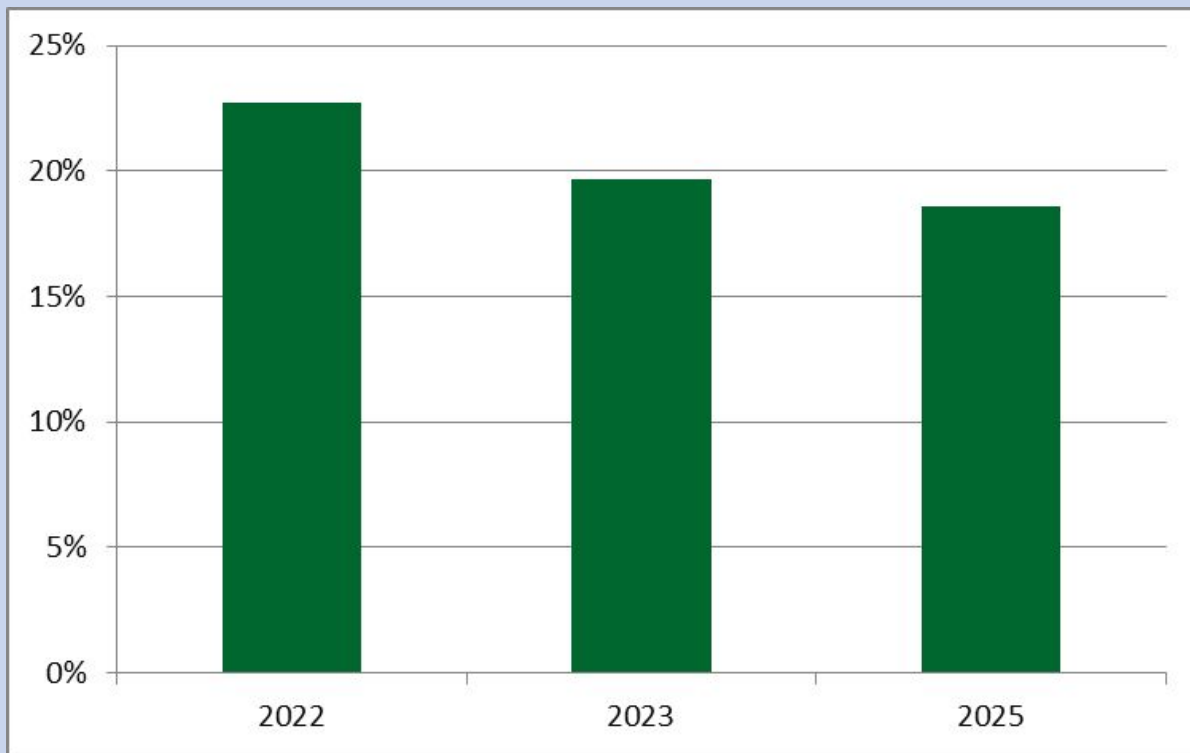
Overview of this Session

As the number of older adults becoming homeless grows, and with more at risk of homelessness, how are service providers working together to serve this vulnerable population?

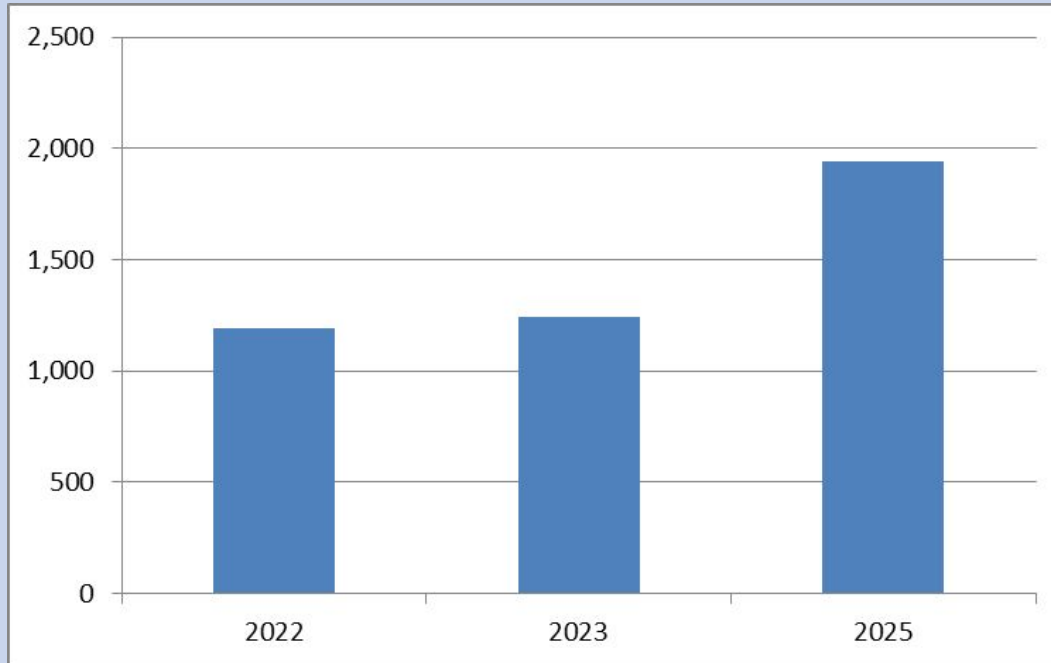
Today we'll explore the impact of the prioritization of older adults within homeless and housing services, the gaps in senior-specific services, and ways that we can collaborate more effectively.

WHAT WE'RE HEARING AND SEEING

- 55 is the new 70 - homelessness exacerbates aging
- Requests for housing services from older adults is up 30%
- A higher percentage of our clients struggle with substance abuse
- More of our clients report domestic violence history
- Sharp increase of co-occurring health (physical and behavioral) issues
- 92% of NWPP clients live alone
- Chronic homelessness in older adults ages 55 - 64 is double that of older adults age 65+
